Chagal, Kahlo, Dubuffet, Clemente, Diebenkorn, Beuys, Nerdrum, to name a few, but my main influences derive from Renaissance and Medieval art. I believe that in some way we carry experiences of millennia through our DNA, and I have been given the gift to express this. Ultimately, it is my hope that upon reflection the viewer may consider unspoken possibilities, question his or her own ideology and that of the human condition too.
